

Here are three more ways to say: "Thank you"



يزاك الله خير yizaak Allah khair - May God reward you



In Emirati dialect, there are multiple ways to express gratitude. Learning different ways to say thank you in the Emirati dialect is important as it shows respect for the culture and fosters stronger connections with Emirati speakers.

Being able to ask for and give opinions in the Emirati dialect is a practical skill for daily interactions with native speakers. These phrases are used frequently in both formal and informal settings. Mastering the art of expressing and sharing opinions, ideas, and thoughts is particularly beneficial for intermediate students, as it facilitates engaging conversations, sharing personal perspectives, and comprehending others in various everyday scenarios.


